The Spiritual Life Committee is planning this service. If you are willing to help with a part of the service, please email or call the office.


## **Clothing & Kleenex Drive**

#### **Council Meeting Minutes**

June 18, 2025

**Call to Order**: Council President, John Fineran opened the meeting at 6:30 PM.

Council members in attendance were John Dorfler, Josie Krohnke, Leisha Kragel, Roberta Jepsen, John Bahnsen, Seth Neubauer. Kirk Manchester and Tammy Neubauer (Financial Secretary) were also present. Jill Sedore was absent.

**Opening Prayer:** Kirk opened with a prayer.

**Approval of Minutes:** A motion was made to approve the minutes from the May 21, 2025 meeting and seconded. Motion carried.

**Approval of Financial Report:** A motion was made to approve the financial report. It was seconded. Motion carried.

**Bills to be paid:** A motion was made to pay the June bills and was seconded. Motion carried.

#### **Committee Reports:**

**CE:** Showed a movie June 14. Attendance was poor but the movie was good. Jessica has picked up the VBS decorations from a church in Denison.

**CSFD:** Scholarship interviews are scheduled for June 28.

CSFI: Have not met.

**Property:** Parking lot work is progressing. Lawns will be sprayed when weather conditions are right.

**Spiritual Life**: Decorated the sanctuary for Pentecost. Laity Sunday has been set for August 24.

**Missions & Outreach:** The community picnic has been cancelled for this year, due to the construction and the condition of the lawn.

**Stewardship:** No report **Endowment:** No report.

**Pastor's Report:** Council reviewed the report submitted, listing visiting elderly and giving communion,

preaching at Homestead once a month and other pastoral duties. Psychological evaluation is scheduled and his class will run from June 23-October 17 to become a licensed lay leader.

#### **Old Business:**

**Kirk's Contract:** It was moved and seconded to approve Kirk's contract as revised. Motion carried.

Worship at the Pond: Kirk is planning to go forward with worship at the pond June 22, even with the extreme heat expected.

John Wulf Money: Seth talked to a board member of the Grant Cemetery about a donation to repair and level some headstones. He is waiting to hear back if they are interested in this. Leisha will be checking into the same need for Morgan Cemetery. Seth has received an estimate of cost per headstone. A decision was tabled at this time.

Kevin Neubauer was contacted about the deteriorating bench in front of the post office that was given in memory of Fred and Elsie Carstensen in 1999. Since this is not a donation from Jens A. Carstensen or Carstensen Brothers Memorial, council feels it is not our right or responsibility to remove and/or replace it. Leisha will talk to Mayor Beth Winguist about this.

Since the basketball hoop was in bad shape in the parking lot, it will be replaced using John Wulf funds. It was moved and seconded to purchase and install a new basketball hoop with funds from John Wulf. A cap of \$2,000 was given to ensure a quality, non-adjustable hoop is installed. Motion carried.

Combine Missions/Spiritual Life: The chairs of the committees have spoken and agree this may be a good idea due to the number of active members of each committee. This would require a by-laws change so would need to be presented at the annual meeting.

#### **New Business:**

Council discussed phone call coverage when Candice is not in the office. After discussion, it was decided the current phone message is appropriate for coverage as it refers to Kirk's cell phone in case of emergency. Non-emergent callers can leave a message and their concern will be addressed the next day the office is open.

#### (Council Minutes continued)

Parking lot traffic was addressed. Staff and others have noted the heavy use of the parking lot as a street by the general public and the high rate of speed vehicles travel at. Chains and gates were discussed with a general consensus that is not welcoming. After discussion, it was moved and seconded to purchase 3 signs to "slow down and watch for children" at the entrances.

There was discussion about installing cameras outside the church due to an increase in vandalism. Seth will be contacting a company about cameras to install. Roberta will also contact a company she is familiar with for an estimate. Leisha moved and Josie seconded to allow a \$5000 budget to purchase and install cameras.

A bill for partial payment for parking lot work was received just before the meeting. It was moved and seconded the motion to approve the payment.

John Dorfler requested additional handicap parking spaces be added on the west side of the church when the parking is painted. Council decided two spaces on the west side of the church and two or three on the north side of the chapel should be sufficient. The congregation will be asked to use the big parking if they have no difficulties walking and leave the other unmarked spaces that are closer to the church for those not as mobile.

The next meeting will be July 16 at 6:30.

With no further discussion, a motion was made to adjourn and was seconded. The Lord's Prayer was recited and the meeting was adjourned.
