### **DECEMBER STEWARDSHIP**

Last month I explained how we develop the budget for the next year and warned you it always an educated guess. We never know how prices will change and how much! One way the congregation can help is to assist us is to brainstorm ways to save money. This month I challenge you to come up with some ways to cut expenses and still have an active and vibrant church.

The first thing we can look at is energy savings. You have all been exposed to methods to decrease energy use – turn off lights in unoccupied rooms, lower the thermostat in the winter and raise it in the summer. We have no intention of forcing you to wear a parka in church in the winter but if the running fans bother you, move to a different spot so you don't feel a draft. Please don't complain if the temperature is lowered a degree. Use solar gain on sunny days for natural warming and cover windows on cold, windy days. Your utility company can give you all kinds of ideas.

Be prudent in use of supplies and office materials. Recycle communion printouts as the order rarely changes. Recycle what you can. Occasionally volunteer to help Candice to lighten her job. We don't want to lessen her hours but help manage the work load. That means meeting deadlines to get reports and schedules to the office.

If you use the kitchen or basement, please leave it as clean as you found it. That means laundering the towels you used, wiping counter tops, and labeling things you store in the refrigerator or freezer.

We have only a limited time before Gracie graduates and is off to college. We will miss her cookies and other treats. Anyone willing to take the job – it does pay? We don't want to stop as it is a time of precious congregational fellowship.

I challenge each of you to think of ways to reduce our spending without reducing our fellowship, meaningful worship, influence in the community, and mission efforts. I'll bet you can come up with idea that never entered my mind.

Remember the time and talent arms of stewardship. We want to be thrifty, not stingy!

#### **SANCTUARY CURTAINS**

You might have heard someone talking about the curtains on the East windows in the sanctuary. We are aware they are several years old and get a lot of morning sunshine. There are no holes, plans to clean or launder them (which could accelerate problems), and no committee to investigate replacements. We have considered solar shades that roll from the top.

Council decision is we would like to designate this project as a memorial project. We have more than \$1000 of mostly undesignated money for memorials in the clearing account. With no indepth study of the options, we estimate the cost will probably be in the range of \$10,000, maybe more. We want to offer the opportunity to contribute to the project. Once we reach 50% or so of the projected cost, we will appoint a committee to gather information and costs. Then we can actively pursue more income. Hopefully, they won't suddenly develop problems that require faster action!

#### **Church Council Minutes**

#### October 25, 2023

- Call to Order—President Sandy Lacey called the meeting to order. Those present were Sandy, Leisha, Jeff, Judy, John B., John D., Cheri, Pastor Kirk. Absent was Seth.
- Candice addressed the Council about days off, which will be on a rotation. So, she can substitute teach during the week: Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays. She would be available to sub on those days and work two days at the church. She would most likely sub two days and say no on the third day. She's hoping to squeeze time in for subbing. Amotion was made to approve this and seconded. The motion carried.
- Pastor Kirk opened the meeting with a prayer.
- A motion to approve the September minutes was made and was seconded. The motion to approve the minutes carried.
- A motion was made to approve the financial report and was seconded. The motion carried.
- A motion was made to approve the bills to be paid and was seconded. (We are still holding the payment for the TKE \$3,451 until things are negotiated). The motion carried.

#### Committee Reports:

- CE: Working on sprucing up one of the Sunday School rooms with paint and new lights. Talked about how Trunk or Treat went well. They had 17 trunks and over 50 kids attend. They will start practice for the Christmas Program, which will be December 3<sup>rd</sup>, the first Sunday of Advent (December 10<sup>th</sup> as a snow day).
- CSFD: Met about the CDs and found a good rate. They will meet again in December.

CSFI: Nothing to report.

Property: The roof is being worked on. Ken is dealing with TKE and their bill. The bill is an exorbitant amount and no work was done to fix the elevators.

- Spiritual Life: New shelf unit was built to organize Christmas items. Working on more "Welcome Bags" are being made. Recently cleaned toys in the toy room.
- Missions & Outreach: They will do Santa Claus Day uptown and will adopt a house of Wesco residents for Christmas giving.
- Stewardship: Sandy is writing an article about explaining how we meet and make our budget.
- Pastor's Report: Pastor did visitations and gave communion. He met with committees, completed four baptisms, did a funeral service, went to the annual meeting, and worked the chicken dinner. There will be a Sing Along on November 19<sup>th</sup>. Also, Pastor will be attending the veteran's banquet and the Veterans' Day Celebration. Christmas is on a Monday this year. Church service will be Sunday night at 5:00.

Old Business:

- Day Care Update: There is no update as of yet; Mike is waiting for news on a grant to help fund the daycare.
- JAC Grants: These are proposed amounts. The council will vote on these amounts.

Total for requested funds was \$61,000 by the aforementioned entities.

The proposed amount by the council will total \$28,000.

A motion was made to pay an amount of \$28,000 in grant money to the aforementioned groups and seconded. The motion carried.

Elevator Repairs: previously talked about with Property Report.

Chicken Dinner: No report as of yet.

#### New Business:

Sanctuary Curtains: Sandy wants to form a committee to look into new curtains. The old curtains are going to fall apart. There was no decision made at this time, but we have a project in the works.

Confirmation: The kids and parents are complaining that they are not learning anything, but numerous confirmation books were left at the church. How do the kids intend to learn if they don't take their books with them? The Council needs to take time on Sundays to teach the kids about the church and its functions. The Council discussed consequences for not going to Sunday church service.

Budget for 2024: Tabled for next meeting.

Claussen Agreement: We have had a discussion with Craig about amending the agreement.

Holiday Schedule: Christmas is on a Monday this year. Church service will be Sunday night at 5:00. The Christmas Program is scheduled for December 3rd.

Where is the church going? We are concerned about the future of the church. How will the church survive with a lack of younger members and dwindling numbers.

Pulpit Supply: Tammy did the sermon on September 24th while Kirk was sick. She will be paid for her services. A motion was made and seconded it. The motion carried.

Adjourned with the Lord's Prayer, concerns, and celebrations.
