Approval of minutes: The minutes were approved by a motion and seconded. The motion carried.

Approval of financial report: The financial report was approved by a motion and seconded. The motion carried.

Bills to be Paid: Bills to be paid with an addition of \$78.31 for Jim and Cheri Streck for Christmas Goody Bags for a total of \$4,583.31 was approved by a motion and seconded. The motion carried.

Committee Reports:

- **CE**: There will be a bake sale January 15th. The kids will be collecting change during children's time for Heifer's International.
- **CSFD**: Second semester scholarship checks are ready to be handed out. Kids did a great job during the chicken dinner. Charitable contributions have been decided for the upcoming year. Thanked John Dorfler for his time on the committee.
- **CSFI**: Several CDs are coming due and need to be redone.
- Property: nothing to report
- Spiritual Life: Christmas Decorations were completed.
- Missions & Outreach: The Christmas sale went well.
- **Stewardship**: Article out for approval for the next newsletter
- **Pastor's Report**: Visitations have been made. Preaching at the Reed House.

Old Business:

- **Streaming and Technology**: Going back to the old way of doing things on Facebook and getting Candice some help.
- **Table and Cupboards**: Gave the tables away from theSunday School Room. Jolene took the cupboards.
- Fine Tune Details on Voting for Missions Committee: Working on getting the people for this committee. Terms for 3 years, 2 years, and 1 year will be drawn from the hat.

New Business:

- 2023 Budget: Everything has gone up and become more expensive. A detailed budget was looked at by the Council. The budget for next year (\$160,400) with an increase of \$17,800 was approved a motion and was seconded. The motion carried.
- Poinsettia Fund Idea for 2023: Instead of buying Poinsettias next year, we purchase a poinsettia tree. When people donate to the fund, we put a poinsettia on the tree. People really do not want the poinsettias that are on the altar. This sounds like a nice solution. A motion was made and seconded that we allow Candice to approach this tree idea. The motion carried.
- Record Annual Meetings on USB to keep in Safe for Historical Purpose: Council thought this sounded like a good idea. A motion was made to record the meeting and seconded. The motion carried.

APPRECIATION FOR MISSIONS AND OUTREACH

If the third amendment to the bylaws passes at our annual meeting, the Missions and Outreach committee will be reorganized. Only one of the current members chose to run for the new committee.

We need to thank the current committee for their years of hard work. They have spearheaded Operation Christmas Child, the Santa Claus Day fundraiser, served Lenten meals, and many other mission projects over the years.

The committee met recently and voted to donate \$2800 to GoServ Global. This charity is active in Haiti and is supported by Conwell Larson from Kiron. Their emphasis at this time is an addition to their school which will allow them to increase from 800 students to approximately 1100 students, continuing to dig wells for safe water sources, and building structures to house some newly developed churches. Our church will receive notice later on which project received our donation. This is a proven, successful mission we are supporting. Congratulations on an excellent choice!

Again, thanks for your service. We look forward to welcoming the retiring committee members to new areas of service at our church.

STEWARDSHIP IN ACTION

Every month we address how our membership can practice stewardship. This month I want to feature our January 8th worship service as stewardship in action.


