#### WHAT IS A GIFT?

When you give a gift, you bestow that thing to anoth-

er. You no longer own it or control it. You might have put some guidelines in place to suggest the use, but it is no longer yours. If it wears out or is broken, our committees or council can decide its disposal. We try very hard to stick to any directives and rarely, if ever have we had an issue. I make that statement to remind you we certainly work for agreement and good relationships.

When John Wulf passed, he designated 10% of the income from his estate to our church for the next ten years. We received the second installment a few months ago and council has made our decisions. The only guideline we received for use of the money is that it is to benefit the people and town of Schleswig.

Our share of the money this year was \$14,415. We used \$5000 to pay bonuses to each of the employees at the Under the Son Childcare, \$4000 to the Christmas Cheer committee to continue growing Schleswig's Christmas decorations and celebrations, and \$5000 will fund Picnic in the Parking Lot for the entire community on July 8<sup>th</sup>. The remaining amount will fund improvements in our kiddie care room and the busy bags for worship services. When Marvel and Sheryl cleaned the Kiddie Care room, they found some toys dirty, broken, and past their prime, so they will be replaced. We don't currently use the room during services but it is a spot for kids while their mothers attend committee meetings and are at other tasks at church. It is definitely used.

We hope you can enthusiastically support each of those gifts to make our community a better place to live and grow!
