Council Meeting Minutes

May 21, 2025

Call to Order: Council Vice-President, John Dorfler, opened the meeting at 6:30 PM.

Council members in attendance were Josie Krohnke, Leisha Kragel, Roberta Jepsen, John Bahnsen, Seth Neubauer and Jill Sedore. Kirk Manchester and Tammy Neubauer (Financial Secretary) were also present. John Fineran was absent.

Opening Prayer: Kirk opened with a prayer.

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made to approve the minutes from the April 18, 2025 meeting and was seconded. Motion carried.

Approval of Financial Report: A motion was made to approve the financial report. It was seconded. Motion carried.

Bills to be paid: A motion was made to pay the May bills. Seconded. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

CE: Jessica has given kids a summer challenge to do some memorization to earn a free pizza certificate. Roberta complemented Jessica on doing a great job with Christian Ed this year. Planning for VBS in August is underway.

CSFD: They are trying to find a date for scholarship interviews and are considering possible donations to Crawford and Ida County food pantries.

CSFI: A CD was reinvested for 8 years.

Property: The elevator is repaired and a surge protector installed. A quote for a new door sensor, with new technology has been received but will not be installed at this time as the old one is still working.

Parking lot work has begun. A change order was discussed at great length to add new steps in the back alley for safer access to the dumpster from the basement and to remove and install new sidewalk along the east sanctuary windows to allow for proper water flow. New downspouts will also need to be installed on the chapel to run rain water underground and remove the icy sidewalk danger. Council discussed adding square poles along sanctuary windows to run downspouts down poles and underground, again to remove damage from water on concrete and for win-

ter safety. It was moved to approve a change order with Heiden Concrete for \$10,000 for the steps and sidewalk additions. A change order would also be approved for \$1,000 with Elevate roofing to add the downspouts on the chapel. A second was made and motion carried. This brings the current cost of project to approximately \$439,660. At this time, council agreed the addition of poles should be considered, but will have Property Committee investigate cost and propose a change order.

Spiritual Life: Some members served Easter breakfast with the help of additional volunteers. They are asking everyone to wear red to worship on June 8, to observe Pentecost. They will also be decorating the sanctuary for Pentecost.

Missions & Outreach: They organized an Easter Egg hunt for kids following worship on Easter and will be organizing the Community Picnic.

Stewardship: No report

Endowment: No report.

Pastor's Report: Council reviewed the report submitted, listing visiting elderly and giving communion, and preaching at Homestead once a month. He has attended community meetings and attended NW Iowa Association meeting. A wedding was also done this month. To meet criteria in his new contract, he has registered for a class to become a licensed lay minister and is working on other requirements to become licensed.

Old Business:

Kirk's Contract: Council reviewed the contract the subcommittee drafted. Changes to vacation and sick days were made by agreement of council members. The contract was presented to Kirk. He stated he would look it over. It was not signed at this time. The current contract will be extended until next meeting.

John Wulf Money: Seth suggested using some of the money to revive headstones at the Grant cemetery as many have fallen and are in disrepair. Many of those needing repair are veterans. Leisha noted the Morgan cemetery has headstones in disrepair as well. It was agreed money could possibly be given to each cemetery. Seth will contact board members for Grant and see if they would be interested in this project and will talk to a Battle Creek individual that does the headstone work to get an estimate of cost.

Summer Worship: The congregational vote revealed a 9 AM start time for worship, from June 1 through August 31, 2025.

Combine Missions/Spiritual Life: This was tabled as the committees have not met together.

Renter fertilizer reports and leases: The fertilizer reports have been turned in from both renters. Council agreed soil maps will be requested from each renter to ensure soil nutrient levels are adequate. This is the last year for the current leases. The church will not be terminating the leases.

New Business:

Worship at the pond: Since no plans have been made and it is short notice, council agreed there would not be church at the pond this year. The exception would be if Judy was set on having it. It was noted next year plans needed to be discussed in February or March to ensure time to make it a special event and publicize the event.

Parsonage Flag Pole: The pole at the parsonage is in poor repair. A new one has been ordered.

Summer Office Hours: Candice requested a change to office hours for the summer. It was moved and seconded to approve June through August office hours as Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9 am -2 pm. Motion carried.

Kirk stated he will be taking vacation August 18-August 25.

The next meeting will be June 18 at 6:30.

With no further discussion, a motion was made by Leisha to adjourn and was seconded by Josie. The Lord's Prayer was recited and the meeting was adjourned.


There were only a few that showed up to our first mystery movie "Blue Miracle". The kids had a great time making their Father's Day project and other crafts. Please try it out at our second
