
I want to talk to you about James 1:19-26. Where it says, "Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires." We have all gotten angry at someone at one point in our lives, where we spoke out of anger and later regretted later for what we have said. Whether it was to our spouse, children, parents, or even to God himself. Like the verse says, we need to listen first and then be slow to speak. Have we apologized to them later for what you have said. I have a story to share with you that I found in Our Daily Bread. As a man was driving in his car, a repair truck cut in front of him and cut him off. He saw a bumper sticker on the truck that said, "how's my driving?" with a phone number. This gentleman picked up his cell phone and proceeded to call the number listed. A woman asked me why he was calling, and he vented his frustration with what had happened. She took down the number of the truck. Then she said, wearily, "You know, you can always call to report someone who's driving nicely." Ouch, the man thought, her tired words instantly punctured his smug self-righteousness. Embarrassment flooded over him. In his zeal for "justice", He hadn't paused to consider how his own rage-filled tone could affect this woman in her difficult job. The disconnect between his faith and his fruitfulness-in that moment-was devastating. It's kind of funny how the gap between our actions and our convictions is what the book of James focuses on. A little later in this chapter of James it says, "Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves, Do what it says. "v 22". None of us are perfect. There was only one person who fit that criteria. Sometimes our "driving" in life needs help, the kind that starts with confession and ask for God's help-trusting him to keep filing off the rough edges of our Character. Why can words spoken quickly in anger be so problematic? How can we be better at living out what we truly believe? When teaching driver education, I saw this a lot, with hand gesture or them yelling at the kids when they passed us. I understand that we all have bad days. But, do we ever think what our words or actions might cause pain to the other person. God has asked us to love one another.

So, the next time you get into this type of situation, listen and think before you speak. It will lead to better conversation and you just might not say something that you may regret later. Show God how you can react in these situations and show love to your neighbor, as he showed us time and time again.

The month of May has been exciting in Sunday School. In the scripture John 10: 1-10 Jesus says we are his sheep and he is the good shepherd. In class, we discussed what a shepherd does for his sheep and what Jesus does for us. Young kids take things very literal, so sometimes they don't understand the metaphors in the Bible. But I think they get this one now. We finished that class with a game. The kids were the shepherds and had to get the balloon sheep into their pen (on the carpet) They found out that it was a little more of a challenge than they thought. Following church, the children's sermon kids came back to the Sunday School room to take a balloon sheep home.



The Sunday School kids worked really hard on painting these stepping stones for their moms for Mother's Day. These girls love to paint and did an awesome job! During our children's sermon in church, we discussed that we should tell our moms and God that we love them, but what's even better is to SHOW them that we love them.





We had prayer stations set up around the Sunday School room. There are many parts of prayer, and we walked through each step with a different activity to help them remember when they are praying. First, there was the Praise Station, this is where we wrote down words that describe God. Next, was the Thankful Station, where they wrote or drew a picture of what they are thankful for on post-its to stick on the paper

on the wall. The 3rd station was the Forgiving Station. We talked about how we all sin and ask God to forgive us. We wrote the sin on our hands and then prayed to God to forgive us. We washed our hands in soapy water to wash the marker off. We found out



that even washable marker doesn't like to wash off easily. Oops. The next station was the Burden Basket. At this station, kids were instructed to think of something that they worry about or "weighs" them down. They drew a picture or wrote the words on a rock and put in the basket symbolizing, giving our worries to God, because God doesn't want us to carry all the weight on our own. Next was the Healing Station, where the children wrote names of people on Bandaids that need God's healing. The band-aids

were placed on a paper on the wall. The last station was the Listening Station. We had a blanket fort with a lantern inside, where each kid was able to sit inside for 1 minute with complete silence to pray and listen for God. The kids really enjoyed the Listening Station.

You must contact the office by July 1st to quality for help from CSFD.


Technology


