Council Meeting Minutes

January 15, 2025

Mike Goodin spoke with the council about the Carstensen Brothers Equities Fund history since 2010 and the current status. Ini-

tially the church received nearly \$1,000,000. He noted at that time the dividends were designated to be used for non-everyday expenses. While he was not able to locate records indicating when this changed, the dividends are now being used to supplement the budget expenses. After expenses are paid for the new parking lot in the spring of 2025, the fund balance will likely be approximately \$3,000,000.

Call to Order: Council Vice-President, John Dorfler, opened the meeting at 6:45 PM.

Council members in attendance were, John Fineran, Josie Krohnke, Leisha Kragel, Seth Neubauer, and by telephone, Cheri Streck. Kirk Manchester and Tammy Neubauer (Financial Secretary) were also present.

Opening Prayer: Kirk opened with a prayer.

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made to approve the minutes from the last meeting, seconded. Motion carried.

Approval of Financial Report: A motion was made to approve the financial report and seconded. Motion carried.

Bills to be paid: A motion was made to pay the January bills and was seconded. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

CE: Leisha reported VBS will be August 3-August 6 this year. Sunday School-Tammy will be working with the kids on bells, Janet will work them on singing and they will be sharing their skills during upcoming worship services. The younger kids continue to work on learning the Lord's Prayer and the older kids the Apostle's Creed. The tubing/sledding event has been changed to a bowling party due to the predicted extreme cold. There will be a skating party in February. Upcoming the older kids will attend Youth Jam in Omaha and will plan and lead the worship service on March 30.

CSFD: Kirk reported scholarship checks have been distributed to recipients.

CSFI: No report

Property: Seth reported they took down the nativity scene and made sure the snow blower is running properly.

Spiritual Life: There are 11 signed up for the book study and they will be working on preparations to host the Easter Breakfast.

Missions & Outreach: Hosted a pot luck meal prior to Christmas decorations being taken down on January 5.

Stewardship: No report

Pastor's Report: Council reviewed the report submitted, listing visiting elderly, a funeral, a zoom meeting, counseling, and attending committee meetings. He met with the Westside UCC.

Old Business:

Westside Church: Kirk met with them January 13. They would like Kirk to do two services a month beginning in July and continuing for 6 months. Council questioned the timing of our worship service and how this would affect confirmation scheduling. Kirk was asked to set up a meeting with Jessica and the confirmation parents in the next week to discuss the timing of confirmation next fall. This will be revisited at the next council meeting.

Teacher Appreciation: A motion was made of a total of 56-\$50 gift certificates to Mike's Bar and Grill be purchased for teachers at Schleswig School, Immanuel Lutheran Preschool and Under the Son Day Care. Funds will come from the John Wulf money. Seconded. Leisha and Josie will distribute them to the learning centers.

OCWM: After discussion, a motion was made and seconded to give \$5,000 from the JAC fund to OCWM. The money will provide funding to ministries of the Iowa Conferences. Motion carried.

New Business:

Christmas Eve Service: Council briefly discussed the Christmas Eve service and the desire for a more celebratory service with a Christmas feel and special music. Plans need to be discussed next fall to ensure efforts are being made to plan a celebratory service.

Annual Meeting: John F. will lead the Annual Meeting on January 26, 2025. Tammy will serve as secretary. Josie will secure three ballot counters prior to the meeting.

Lent Plans: A meal will be served at 6 PM with worship beginning at 6:45 on Wednesday evenings during Lent. The Ash Wednesday service will be in Fellowship Hall as well as the following services. A sign-up sheet for serving meals will be put out, with council serving March 5. Candice and Tammy are working on a change with Easter lilies, to replace the live Easter lilies. More information later.


