



We were concerned we would not serve as many because fields were wet with no combines and crews working. We still had big orders, extra donations, and good attendance. Staley's did their usual organized, good job!

Thank you to all who baked, worked, made calls, invited friends and relatives to join them, did pre-event duties like dishing salads and packaging rolls. Special thanks to Shannon and family for organizing the event. I don't like to single out any faction of workers but our young people earned lots of respect and appreciation. The elevator was not working so they toted things up and down the stairs to the kitchen. That is certainly not a job for someone like me with "old" legs and limited endurance. They did a great job.

NOVEMBER STEWARDSHIP

The end of the year is fast approaching. That means the council will be working to develop the budget for the church's general fund to present to the congregation for approval at our annual meeting. This is not an easy task!

Our income is variable. Dividends from the Carstensen Brothers stock fund does not usually vary a lot. Even if the stock prices go up or down the percent of income is basi-

cally steady. The chance of a big drop would need to have a company or companies drop their dividend substantially. That has not happened in many years. Raises in dividends are usually modest amounts with slow gains. This income provides <u>more</u> than 50% of our money for the budget.

The next source of income is special fund-raising projects – chicken dinner, some Lenten meals (most committees use that income to bolster committee projects), unexpected bequests, garage sale income, and other special projects.

The third revenue producing area is congregational giving. That tends to be totally unpredictable. We have been able to balance the budget in recent years because of generous giving by our members and cost cutting of expenses. This is your pledges, Sunday giving, and other gifts.

The other half of the equation is expenses! Most of that is pure guess. We know our propane costs for the next year. Other bills arrive with increases on a regular basis. Do we pay more for salaries to keep our good employees? Elevator inspections and service steadily increase. Tuning the pianos and organ service grows each year. Utilities creep up. Insurance costs are escalating

Major repairs and half of property insurance and financial inspection (it is not a full audit) are paid 50% from the Carstensen Farm Account. Christian Education budget is supported from the Farm Account. Some special events (for instance Worship at the Pond) are paid from this account.

Despite all the increased spending, we have been able to continue giving to worthwhile projects and requests from our bequests. We cannot support every worthy cause but we prayerfully choose where the money goes. These gifts should be mission oriented and doing God's work.

Does this all sound like your personal budget? We know it does. That is why we ask you to prayerfully consider your gifts to the church. Plan ahead and set aside something each month to help keep the doors open! Another way to help the budget is to give of your time to accomplish some of the tasks around the church. We cannot <u>hire everything done</u>. Our committees do an excellent job of filling those gaps. If you are not active on a committee, maybe it is time that is a way you can support your church.

A quote from Jana Stanfield, a song writer — "I cannot do all the good that the world needs. But the world needs all the good that I can do." Let that become your motto and do all the good you can do!

Missions & Outreach: John B. had nothing to report.

Stewardship: Sandy had nothing to report.

Pastor's Report: Pastor visited people in Omaha Hospitals. He had a graveside service for Paula Kinney. Kirk met with the confirmands and their parents. He also helped with the golf tournament. The fire extinguishers have been updated, but we need one in the furnace room. Pastor is looking into a Bible study group and future ways to sow seeds in the community.

Old Business:

Approval of July minutes: This was completed earlier in the meeting.

Worship time on October 14thwill be at 5:30 on Saturday October 14th.

The Recorder is here and available to operate.

Daycare Update: The grant has not come through yet.

New Business:

JAC Grants: These are proposed amounts. The council will vote on these at the next meeting.

Crossroads of Crawford County asking for \$40,000 (\$20,000 proposed grant)

Neighbor Helping Neighbor asking for \$3,000 (\$3,000 proposed grant)

Schleswig Community School asking for \$3,000. (\$1,000 proposed grant)

Schleswig Golf Course asking for \$10,000 (\$ 1,000 proposed grant)

Christmas Cheer Committee asking for \$5,000. (\$3,000 proposed grant)

The proposed amount by the council will total \$28,000. This will be voted on at the next meeting.

Claussen CD: This needs to be renewed by September 22nd.

Elevator Repairs: The property committee is looking into switching elevator repair companies.

There is a sizable bill for the elevator, and the service by TKE has not been up to par. The bill for TKE was not approved at this time, until more of an explanation is made.

Chicken Dinner: Looking to cut some costs.

Staley's will cater. It will be drive-through. The workers will pay for their meals. The meal will not be free.

Sanctuary Curtains: This will be discussed at a later date.

Confirmation: After some discussion, the council decided to keep confirmation at two years starting in 7th grade.

Adjourned with the Lord's Prayer, concerns, and celebrations.
