

September 17, 2025

Call to Order: Council President, John Fineran opened the meeting at 6:30 PM.

Council members in attendance were Josie Krohnke, Roberta Jepsen, John Bahnsen, Jill Sedore and Seth Neubauer. John Dorfler and Leisha Kragel attended via telephone. Kirk Manchester and Tammy Neubauer were also present.

Opening Prayer: Kirk opened the meeting with a prayer.

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made to approve the minutes from the August 20, 2025 meeting and seconded. Motion carried.

Approval of Financial Report: A motion was made to approve the financial report. It was seconded. Motion carried.

Bills to be paid: A motion was made to pay the September bills, with the addition of \$53.78 to Bomgaars for lawn watering equipment. Seconded. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

CE: They have discussed several Youth Fellowship activities and Trunk or Treat. A date to start confirmation has not been determined.

Property: The lawn has been seeded; parking lot expansion joints are being cleaned and prepared for sealant. Lines will be painted soon. Property has been working hard to keep the new seeding wet. John B. offered the run-off water from his shed to water the lawn.

Pastor's Report: Council reviewed the report submitted, listing visiting elderly, giving communion, a funeral, doing counseling and setting date for confirmation to start. The report states he will meet with confirmation parents yet.

Farm Leases: Chris Ullrich offered \$350 per acre for the farm ground he has been farming. Council instructed John F. to tell them we would do a 1 year lease for \$375, which is the same rent being paid for the other farm ground.
