July 18, 2024

Call to Order—The meeting was called to order by President Cheri Streck. Those present were Cheri, John D., John F., Seth, and Josie. Absent were John B. and Leisha.

Approval of the Minutes: The minutes were approved with changes by a motion and seconded. Motion carried.

Approval of the Financial Report: The financial report was approved by a motion and seconded. Motion carried.

Bills to be Paid: Bills to be paid for a total of \$5,725.26 were approved by a motion and seconded. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

- CE: There will be a movie August 10th in the afternoon. There will be a meeting August 4th after church.
- CSFD: Pam came in Tuesday and said that Scholarship Checks were ready to be handed out to the recipients.
- CSFI: They took money from Home Depot stock and Eli Lilly stock and are planning to reinvest the stock money. This is because too much stock is held in Home Depot and Eli Lilly. They are going to invest the dividend into the daycare and possibly the church parking lot 9 (pending a congregational vote).
- Property: They are still waiting on the tree service company. We have two cracked windows from the hail. They want to sandblast the propane tanks and repaint them. There is a list for work activities for work day. They need to decide on how much to replace on the church sidewalks.
- Spiritual Life: The community picnic was a success.

 The ladies that put it together did an awesome job. There were approximately 100 people. The heat and activities outside of the community were a factor in the attendance. Food Pride was a big help with the community picnic.

Stewardship: Nothing to Report
